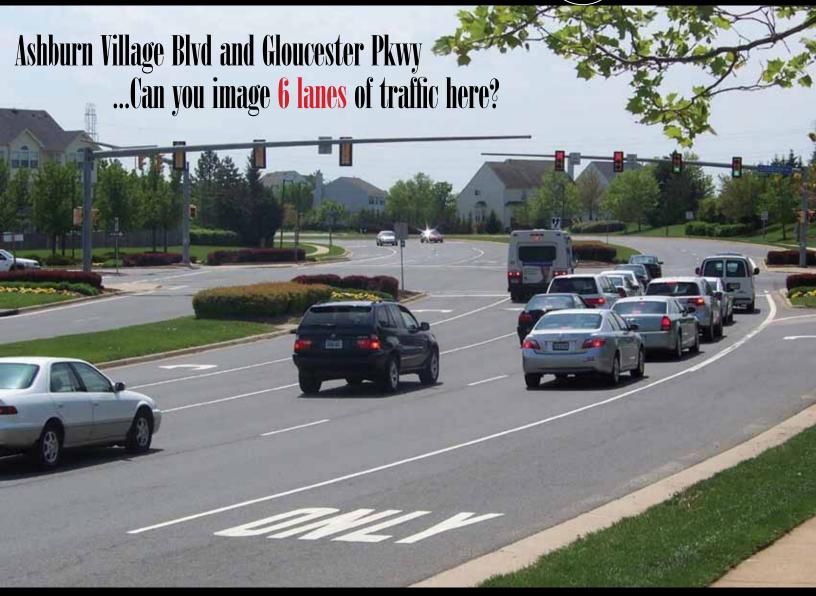

Greetings, fellow Villagers!

Loudoun County Transportation Plan

Some of you may have either read or heard anecdotally that Loudoun County's Transportation Plan is currently under review. It has come to my attention and many other residents that the County has future plans to widen both Ashburn Village Boulevard and Gloucester Parkway to six lanes. We must act now to preserve our home values and our community!

The County Board of Supervisors (BOS) is presently in the process of reviewing the CTP (Countywide Transportation Plan) and will vote sometime in the summer on the plan. If the stipulation for Ashburn Village Boulevard and Gloucester Parkway as six-lane roads is retained in the document, this will spell the eventual demise of Ashburn Village, period. Our community would basically be divided into four parts. Our ability to walk from one end to the other would be cutoff and our children would no



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longer be safe walking or riding their bicycles. On behalf of our community, I have sent a letter to the BOS outlining our opposition to this idea, as the plan is arbitrary and was developed without serious thought for the people of Ashburn Village. However, we are not alone in this fight. The plan would also effect our sister communities of Ashburn Farm and the Courts and Ridges. In Ashburn Farm two of their primary roads, Claiborne Parkway and Ashburn Farm Parkway would be widened. The Courts and Ridges would be affected by the widening of Gloucester from Belmont Ridge Road to Rt. 28 along with our community.

I have made arrangements for Supervisors Waters and Miller, Broad Run and Dulles Districts respectively, to meet with our community on Tuesday, May 25th at 6:00 pm. This community meeting will take place prior to the regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors. It is imperative that you and your neighbors come and voice your opposition to this terrible plan. Even if the County does not have the money now or even five years from now to build these improvements, if these ideas are retained in the plan, they will build it one day. In order to preserve our community we need to work together to have these plans stricken from the overall CTP once and for all. Please join me and show the BOS you are opposed to the demise of Ashburn Village.

Sports Pavilion Renovations - Update

The BOD voted during our April Business Meeting to change course on the renovation/expansion of the Sports Pavilion. Instead of holding a community referendum on the measure to approve the renovation and the financial obligation, we will instead build a comprehensive multiyear plan of enhancements and renovation. The goal is to proceed with changes that will be paid for over the course of any given fiscal year or years and not to exceed an annual amount of 10% of that year's budget, as authorized by the governing documents. Additionally, the BOD has authorized the exploration of new operational models for the facility. The current AVSP Renovation/Expansion Committee will be retained and several community input sessions will be planned to solicit feedback for a phased multi-year facelift. These sessions will be communicated on our web site and through articles in The Villager within the next month.

May Is National Electrical Safety Month.

Safety officials warn that counterfeit electrical products could put you at risk of injury or death. Counterfeit products can cause fires, explosions, shocks and electrocutions. Often, manufacturers of counterfeit products skimp in the process to save money. Fake consumer products are **not tested** for compliance to relevant safety standards.

Counterfeits can be hard to spot. They could be a knock-off of a name brand product or have an unauthorized certification marking. The following tips can help you to avoid counterfeit hazards:

- Carefully examine the product, the packaging and the labeling.
- Look for a certification mark from an independent testing organization, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL) and if the manufacturer's label looks different than usual it may be a counterfeit.
- Trust your instincts. If the price is "too good to be true," it could be because the product is unsafe.
- Be extra careful when buying from a street vendor, non-authorized dealer, dollar store, online retailer or an individual.
- Ask about the return policy. Get a receipt and look for missing sales tax. Businesses selling counterfeit goods often don't report their sales.
- Report safety-related incidents to the manufacturer or CPSC.

SUMMER REMINDERS

Air Conditioners

As summer approaches and the weather begins to warm, air conditioners will be turned on and used for several months before the weather cools again. PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU ARE CHECKING THE DRAIN TUBE IN YOUR AIR CONDITIONING UNIT ON A REGULAR BASIS TO ENSURE THAT IT DOES NOT BECOME CLOGGED. ALSO, PLEASE CHANGE OUT YOUR FILTER REGULARLY AS WELL. IF THE DRAIN TUBE BECOMES CLOGGED, WATER WILL OVERFLOW OUTSIDE THE AIR CONDITIONING UNIT TO YOUR FLOOR, CAUSING WATER TO INTRUDE INTO

3rd Floor Hallway Windows

If you open the 3rd floor hallway windows, please be sure to close them again. When 3rd floor hallway windows are opened, this allows birds to get into the hallways. It also allows for rain to get in the hallway area as well.

Front Porches

Please refer to Policy Resolution #5 regarding front porch furniture and plants: one heavy park bench made of wood, wrought iron or a combination of the two; no cushions, two matching non-folding, outdoor wrought iron or white mesh chairs in cream, white or green; no lawn ornaments, no fences or borders. 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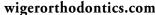
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Per the Loudoun County Fire Marshal - **Propane tanks** used on any grills regardless of their size are prohibited on the property at Lakeshore. If you happen to have one on your grill it must be removed immediately and disposed of properly. The Ashburn Fire Department

Gas Grills, Charcoal Grills and Tiki Torches

will receive these tanks at their facility on Ashburn Road. No charcoal grills are allowed on the decks or patios when in use. You must pull your grill out 15 feet from the building when in operation. Violation of this Fire Code is a class one misdemeanor, punishable by law. Please keep everyone safe. Tiki torches are not allowed on decks and patios as they are a fire hazard.

Fireworks

Fireworks are not allowed on Lakeshore property. If you see someone lighting fireworks please call the Loudoun County Sheriff's office at 703-777-1021.

Bird Feeders

Please do not put bird food in bird feeders. The bird food not only will attract birds making nests but the food will also attract other rodents such as mice.

Dogs

As the weather is getting nicer and you are out walking with your dog, please be sure to pick up after your dog. Also, please remember that dogs must be on a leash.

Patios and Decks

Please do not use your patios and decks as a storage area. Refer to your by-laws regarding decks and patios. Store bicycles in your storage bin or in your unit.

No Car Washing

Hoses are allowed to water plants. Please wind the hose back up after use. Car washing on the property is not allowed.

You Can Grow Anything in a Container!

Urban Horticulturist Loudoun County Extension

Townhomes, condominiums, or apartments don't give us much room to grow plants. We may have only a small area to garden or perhaps just a balcony. Some of us just like to grow plants in containers! I have heard Karen Rexrode (local perennial expert and photographer) speak to our Master Gardener Volunteers several times about Chanticleer Garden in the Philadelphia area and what beautiful containers they have planted throughout their gardens. A couple of years ago I had the opportunity to visit Chanticleer and they did have some of the most beautiful containers I have ever seen. You can grow anything in a container. You can be very creative with your plant combinations. Some plants may require special soil mixes, but most will do fine in a high

May Tips for the Garden

When planting a new shade tree, consider whether it is messy or neat in appearance, weak- or strong-wooded, and long- or short-lived. Resist the temptation to plant a fast-growing, weak tree for quick shade.

Some trees that are messy and weak-wooded include silver maple, hybrid poplar, mimosa, weeping willow, black cherry, and Eastern cottonwood. Better choices are Chinese elm, Japanese zelkova, pin oak, red maple, river birch, tulip poplar, and willow oak.

Rough or careless handling of balled-and-burlapped trees can break the soil ball, damaging or breaking off most of the roots, and result in the death of the tree. Never pick up a B&B tree by its trunk; instead, carry it by the root ball, being gentle when putting it down.

Regularly water newly planted trees and shrubs during the first three to four years after planting to help establish a good root system. They need at least 1 inch of water each week. It is better to water deeply once a week than to water lightly every day; the former practice encourages deep, drought-resistant roots while the latter practice encourages surface roots that may suffer during dry spells. Apply an organic mulch to conserve moisture and control weeds.

Most evergreens have many roots near the soil surface. Avoid deep cultivation, which might wound roots.

Prune out winter-killed wood on trees and shrubs by cutting back to green wood after new growth begins.

Watering with soaker hoses or drip irrigation will reduce the spread of blackspot in roses.

quality potting mix. There are many types of containers that you can use. You can purchase concrete containers, several types of lighter weight materials that look like concrete, terra cotta, ceramic, wooden barrels cut in half, and plastic. If you are a little more eclectic, you can use items that you might have around your home as containers for growing plants. Old dishes, old wooden baskets, old wheel barrows, watering cans, old buckets, old cast iron pots, or even old boots or shoes are some examples. My grandmother was a little disappointed with me when she discovered that I had taken the old cast iron bean pot she had given me and turned it into a container full of impatiens! Just make sure any item you may use as a container has drainage holes in the bottom and have fun gardening.

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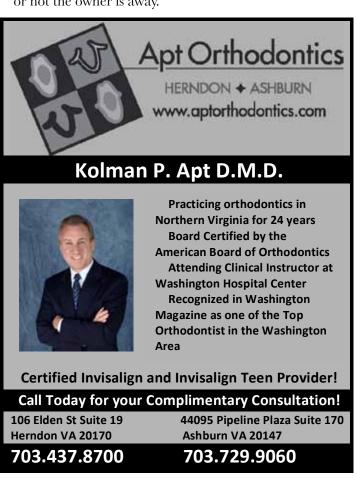

Spring Time!!!

Some people will be planning to take a well deserved holiday during this time of the year. When you wish to take a vacation, plan on doing some basic crime prevention to help protect your property.

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office would like to offer citizens a few safety tips to make the Spring Break a bit safer.

- Tell a trusted neighbor when you will be away. Have them pick up your mail, newspapers, and keep an extra eye out on your property.
- Make your home look as if it is occupied. Have your lights on timers that have random on-off switches.
- If you have an automatic garage door opener make sure you lock, unplug, or turn the power off to it. Also a good idea would be to use the manual lock.
- You can call the Sheriff's Office nonemergency number and ask for a patrol unit to check on your house while you are away.
- Secure all vehicles that will be left at home and remove all small electronics, garage door openers, and money from those vehicles.
- Make sure the yard is taken care of (grass mowed and yard cleaned) as this can be a good indicator of whether or not the owner is away.



Walking, Jogging, and Running Safety

Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Unit has been getting questions about how to keep safe when outside running, jogging and walking.

- One of the main things would be to pay attention to your surroundings and don't get complacent.
- Stay in groups.
- Tell people where you are going and when to expect you back.
- Carry a cell phone and an ID with you.
- Try to only go out in the daylight hours.
- Walk, jog, or run on well lit and well traveled pathways.
- Vary your walking/ running paths.
- Report any suspicious activity.

Spring Cleaning and Residential Security

With warmer weather upon us, soon we will be tasked with the weekly yard work and maintenance. Please remember the following tips to help keep your home safe from burglars.

- Bushes and shrubs should not be allowed to grow higher that 24 inches or higher than the lower ledge of a first floor window.
- Check outside lights to make sure they are working properly.
- Keep larger tree limbs from hanging below six feet from

Warm up

As the weather gets warmer normally the crime rate picks up. Also as the economy gets worse the crime rates will increase. Swimming Pool Rules

Ashburn Village Community Association (AVCA) Swimming Pool Rules

The Lifeguards and Manager-on-Duty (MOD) have the authority to enforce more stringent rules than those listed here to ensure the health, safety, and comfort of all participants.

Participants not abiding by these rules may be asked to leave the facility and may also be subject to suspension or termination of facility privileges.

Identification of Residents

All residents and guests 6 years of age or older must provide either a valid AVCA Membership Card or a valid AVCA Guest Pass to gain entry to any AVCA pool.

Pool Closings

In addition to Loudoun County and State of Virginia Health Code Standards, the pool will be closed for the following reasons:

- Operational and mechanical difficulties affecting pool water quality.
- During severe weather conditions (heavy rain, lightning, and thunder) and warnings, especially when visibility to the pool bottom is compromised (deck also closed).
- For 30 minutes following the last occurrence of thunder or lightning (deck also closed).
- For a period of time following any mishap that results in feces or vomit in the pool water.

Appropriate Behavior

- All swimmers MUST shower before entering the pool.
- Proper swimwear is required, which does NOT include jeans, cutoffs, or thongs.
- NO PETS are allowed in the pool or on the pool deck.
- NO GLASS, ALCOHOL, or TOBACCO is permitted anywhere in the pool area. Possession of alcohol will result in immediate expulsion.
- Food is NOT allowed in the pool area except in designated eating areas. Non-alcoholic drinks in non-glass containers are permitted.
- Audio equipment must be used with personal headphones in pool and locker room areas.
- Swimmers MUST stay off lap lanes, ropes, safety lines and lifeguard stands.
- Please refrain from distracting the Lifeguards while on duty; they are here for your safety.
- Inappropriate behavior such as running, pushing, wrestling, excessive splashing, standing or sitting on shoulders, or spitting of water is NOT allowed and may result in expulsion from the pool area.
- Children, ages five and older, MUST use their gender appropriate changing room.
- Private parties cannot be accommodated.
- Swim aides, floatable objects, and pool toys will be allowed at the Lifeguard's discretion.
- All children who are not toilet trained MUST wear approved swimmers' diapers while in the pool.
- A 10-minute Safety Break for Adult Swim will be held at 50 minutes after the hour, every hour. Only adults (18 years or older) and infants accompanied by adults are permitted in the pool during Break.
- Admission will be refused to any person having a skin disease, inflamed eyes, nasal or ear discharge, or any communicable disease.

Health and Safety

- DIVING IS NOT PERMITTED, except in designated areas.
- All children 4 years of age or younger must be supervised by an adult (16 years of age or older) within arm's length at all times when on the pool deck or in the pool.
- All children regardless of age using inflatable armbands (i.e., water wings) or any approved Coast Guard flotation device MUST be supervised one-on-one by an adult who is in the water and within arm's length of the child.
- Children under age 12 MUST be directly supervised by a responsible individual age 16 or older.

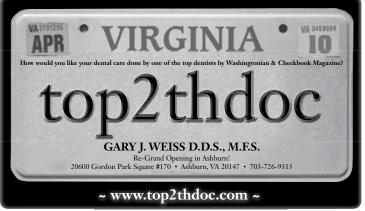

The EPA made an announcement on March 17, 2010 concerning their investigation of topical flea and tick products. They announced that new labeling requirements, public education, and monitoring for adverse events will become part of increased regulatory efforts to combat the rise in reactions seen with these "spot on" products.

This comes after a year of investigations following an increase in the number of reactions (nearly double) from 2007 to 2008. Though the majority of reactions reported were minor, a small percentage of them included seizures and rarely death. The more severe reactions were mostly from inadvertently placing canine spot-ons to cats, or from small dogs receiving too much product (say from a vial meant for a larger dog).

EPA spokesman Steve Owens said, "These products are safe and effective, but the labeling is inadequate." Of note, products sold through veterinarians had a much lower percentage of cat incidences compared to dog incidences. The reason for this relatively low occurrence may be that since this product is sold through veterinarians, there is a higher compliance rate for proper use and/or the product has a lower percentage of the active ingredient.

It is good to know that the overall reaction percentage in these cases was about 1.6 incidences per 10,000 doses.

These products are meant to repel and kill fleas and ticks, and they do a good job. Still, they have to be used with caution and understanding. If a cat accidentally receives a permethrin-based topical preventive, it can have seizures and possibly die. Also, if a small dog receives too much product, it can cause a local irritation or possibly burn.

The alternatives are few. You can try mild, safe products like Avon Skin-So-Soft, but those are only somewhat effective in protecting against fleas and especially ticks. You can try oral products that protect against fleas and vaccinate against Lyme Disease. Or you can do nothing and hope that your dog doesn't get bitten by a tick and contract Lyme Disease (which is currently an epidemic in Loudoun County). Personally, I use the spot-ons that we sell on my dogs and am totally confident that they are doing their job in a safe and effective way with no side effects.

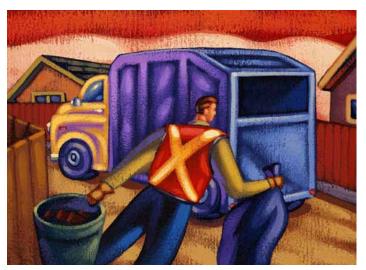
- Trash Pick-ups will occur on Monday and Thursday each week
- Yard waste will be collected on Monday along with trash
- · Recycling will be collected on Thursday along with trash
- Bulk item collection will be once a week by appointment. Bulk items include furniture, extra
 yard waste, mattresses and other large non-metallic household items less than 2 cubic yards in
 volume. There is no charge for these items. Ferrous metals/white goods such as stoves, refrigerators, etc will be picked up for an additional charge. Please call 703-368-0500 to make the
 specific appointment.

Please remember that all pickups are curbside in front of each townhome or single family home. Containers, toters, yard waste, etc. may not be placed at mailboxes or parking islands.

For trash you may use any toter or container that you have used in the past. If you have rented a toter from New Vision, you may keep that toter and continue to use it. Toters are no longer available for rental. When you need a new trash container you may purchase them from a local store such as Home Depot or Lowes. Alternatively you may purchase a 96 gallon trash toter through the Association for \$85.00; just stop by the office, make the payment and we will deliver the toter to your home within 14 days.

For recycling you will have some new choices. First you may continue to use the bins delivered to all homes in 2009. If you are missing a 16 gallon recycling bin, just stop by the office and we will give you one during the month of May. If you have more recycling than fits in 1-2 bins and you live in a single family home or a townhome with a garage, please call the office and give us your address. We will deliver a 64 gallon recycling toter within three weeks. All recycle items may be placed in the same container.

Yard waste should be placed in the paper yard waste bags available at Giant, Lowes, Home Depot and many other stores or clear plastic bags. Branches and limbs must be less than 4 inches in diameter and must be cut to less than four feet in length. Bundle them together with string or rope so that they can be more readily collected.



Prohibited items will not be picked up. These include but are not limited to dead animals, oil, paint, stains, batteries, construction and remodeling materials, manure, tree stumps, mulch, soil, dirt, stone, rocks, cement, bricks, poisons, acids, caustics, explosives or other similar materials.

Christmas trees will be collected with yard waste on the first two Mondays in January. Please remember to remove all decorations and lights.

Holiday Pickups will take place on all holidays except New Years Day, Christmas and Thanksgiving Day. If a service day falls on one of these three, the next pickup will be the next scheduled pickup day.

Inclement weather such as blizzards or ice may preclude the safe collection of trash and recycling on the regular schedule. The next pickup will be the next regularly scheduled pickup day.

Residents of Ashburn Meadows Apartments, Saddleridge Apartments, Wingler House (East and West),
Lakeshore Condominiums and Four Season Condominiums are not affected by this change and will continue
to have trash and recycling services provided through their management company.



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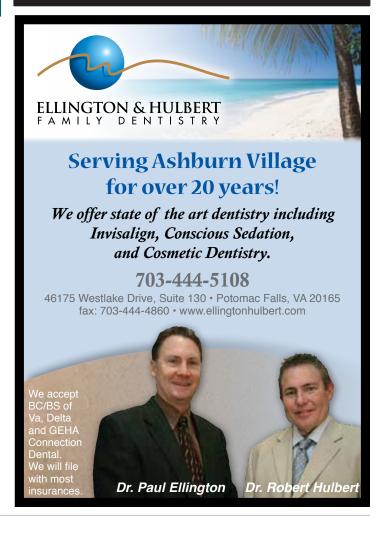

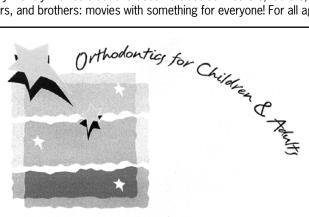

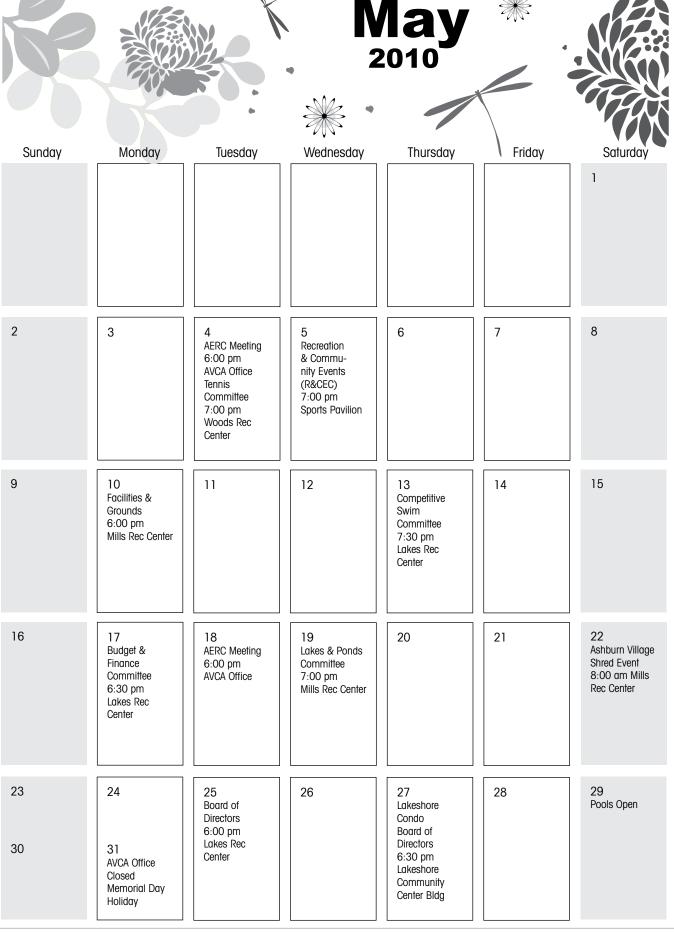
